


- Canadian Shipments have gone down 28% (ab 12M cbm)






What is available of AAC is more and more difficult to harvest:

- Cost of equipment / fuel / insurances is increasing exponentially.

 - Beetles










- Looks small, but from a regional point of view, it is significant

Softwood lumber dispute


Has been going since November 2016.

- Current combined rate (Aug 24) is 14.54% (previously 8.05%)
- It is projected that the rate will double in the second half of 2025 (sixth administrative review)
- Canada has challenged all with WTO & CUSMA (new NAFTA)





Nb of people, aged 30 to 45, in USA population













Housing starts / R&R



American builders' anticipation survey


