



• Biggest driver: The **young population** has a growing need for living space (22 countries, 465 million inhabitants, 221 Million <24 y).




Sporting Events:




## Shifting Markets for European Softwood Lumber








# Lumber demand in MENA-Region

only softwood lumber; in Mio. m<sup>3</sup>










# Germany's Forest Stocks (2012-2022)












#### **DEVELOPMENT OF SOFTWOOD LUMBER IMPORTS** | 1ST HALF-YEAR 2024



## Summary and Outlook

- Stable market ties between Europe and MENA have developed over decades.
- Europe's wood availability and usage are shifting (more wood in construction).
- A third of European sawn timber is exported overseas, but this may change.
- per capita consumption is very low
- Wood usage in MENA is expected rise and to evolve ("green building").
- In the future, the region will no longer use wooden products for single-use purposes but for higher-quality and more durable applications.
- MENA will need new price levels and material sources.
